Cookies Policy

1. Introduction

KYND Limited (“KYND”, “we”, “our”, or “us”) uses Cookies to store and retrieve information on and from your browser when you visit our website (the “Site”). The purpose of this document (“Cookies Policy”) is to help you understand how we use Cookies.

2. What are Cookies and Why Do We Use Cookies?

2.1 Cookies are small data files which are placed on your computer, tablet, or mobile phone (“Device”) when you visit our Site. Cookies collect information relating to your use of our Site, information about your Device, such as IP address and browser type, demographic data, and, if you reached the Site through a third party Site, which third party Site directed you to the Site.

2.2 When you re-visit our Site, Cookies allow our Site to recognize you, remember your preferences, and tailor your use of the Site. Cookies also enable us (i) to relate your use of the Site to information that you have specifically and knowingly provided to the Site, and (ii) to track your use of the Site. Cookies may be used to enable certain functions of the Site, to provide analytics, and to enable advertisements delivery, including behavioural advertising, to allow us to store your login information and your personal preferences for the Site. Cookies provide us with important usage data, *e.g.*, how often you visit, where you go at the Site, and what you do there. In sum, information provided by Cookies help us to provide you with a better user experience.

2.3 Cookies are referred to as either “session” or “persistent” Cookies, depending on for how long they are used:

- Session Cookies last only for the duration of your online session and disappear from your Device when you close your browser. Session Cookies are not stored on the hard drive of your Device.
- Persistent Cookies are stored on the hard drive of your Device after the browser has been closed and last until you delete them or they reach their expiration date. Persistent Cookies are activated each time you visit the site where the cookie was generated.

3. What Types of Cookies Do We Use?

The types of Cookies that may be used on our Site fall into one of three categories as follows:

(a) **‘Strictly Necessary’ Cookies.** These Cookies are essential for the operation of our Site and enable you to access certain features. Without these Cookies, we would be unable to provide you with the online services you request. These Cookies do not track where you have been on the internet and do not gather information about you that could be used for marketing purposes.

(b) **Functional Cookies.** Functional Cookies are used to recognize you when you return to our Site. They also remember your preferences (such as your username, language, and region) on our Site and enable us to personalize our content for you. The information collected by these Cookies is usually anonymized, so we cannot identify you personally. Functional Cookies do not track your internet usage or gather information which could be used for selling advertising, but they do help with serving advertising.

(c) **Analytical Cookies.** Analytical Cookies are used to monitor the performance of our Site. For example, they allow us to recognize and count the number of visitors and to see how visitors move around our Site when they are using it. The information provided by these Cookies allows us to analyse patterns of user behaviour and we use that information to enhance user experience or identify areas of the Site which may require maintenance. All of the information collected by these Cookies is anonymous and is only used for statistical purposes.

4. Third Party Cookies

4.1 When you browse our Site some Cookies may be set by third parties, over which we have no control. When you visit a page with embedded third party content, the service provider may set its own Cookies on your Device. You may also encounter third party Cookies resulting from our use of third party services, which help us monitor traffic on our Site. We do not control the use of these Cookies, and you should refer to the relevant third party websites for more information.

4.2 In addition, our Site includes social media features such as the "Like," "Share" and "Follow" buttons for LinkedIn. These features may set a Cookie to enable the feature to function properly.

5. How can I Manage or Disable Cookies?

5.1 There are a number of ways for you to manage Cookies. Your browser settings should allow you to accept or reject Cookies and you can set your browser to prompt you before accepting a Cookie.

5.2 You may also be able to disable placement of some (but not all) Cookies by setting your browser to decline Cookies, though this may degrade your user experience. Additionally, if you change computers or web browsers, you will need to opt out again.

5.3 Please be aware that if you set your browser to disable Cookies entirely it may affect the way our Site operates and you may not be able to use certain features of our Site.
